Gary S. Marshall, M.D.

Dr. Marshall is a Professor of Pediatrics and director of the fellowship-training program at the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Louisville School of Medicine; he has been a staff member since 1989. Dr. Marshall received his undergraduate degree from the University of Pennsylvania and his medical degree from Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee. Dr. Marshall is perhaps best known nationally for his work in the area of vaccine advocacy, education and clinical trials, and for his book, now in its second edition, entitled *The Vaccine Handbook: A Practical Guide for Clinicians*.



Renee P. McLeod, Ph.D., APRN, CPNP

Dr. McLeod is the dean of the School of Nursing and Health Professions at Brandman University, part of the Chapman University System. She was previously with Arizona State University and Vanderbilt University. Dr. McLeod has 33 years of practice as a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner, consultant, and speaker for companies that make Immunizations for the last 15 years. She has served on California Immunizations Committee and San Diego Immunizations committee, been a past national Special Interest Group Chair on Immunizations for National Association of Pediatric Nurse Practitioners, and is currently member of the CME Committee for National Foundation for Infectious Disease.
